-The Supervisor shall preside at all meetings of the Board and shall preserve order and decorum in the best interest ad conduct of the meeting.

- The Supervisor, immediately following the opening of every regular meeting of the Town Board, shall proceed to the regular order of town business as follows: Salute to the Flag. At this time the public shall be invited to address their comments or questions to the Town Board for an allotted period time not to exceed three (3) minutes each per person.

-Any person invited to speak to the own Board shall address and direct his/her remarks to the Town Board as a whole, not to other members of the audience in an attempt elicit public debate.

- No member of the public shall be allowed to engage in any demonstration, distraction, disruption, or any other conduct inconsistent with being able to conduct an official order of business during a meeting.

- Following the first public comments comes the approval of previous minutes discussions of communications addressed to the Town Board, introductions of resolutions and motions, reports of committees and subcommittees, and reports of officers and departments.

- In addition, every resolution or motion must be seconded before being put to a vote by the Supervisor and all resolutions and motions shall be duly recorded in their entirety in the official minutes of the Town Board.

- The public shall, additionally, be invited to comment on any motion or resolution not previously listed or that was omitted from the pre-meeting agenda that is brought before the Town Board during a meeting.

-If the Supervisor is unavailable to preside over a meeting, the Deputy Supervisor shall assume said duties. If both the Supervisor and the Deputy Supervisor are unavailable to attend any public meeting and a quorum is present, the remaining Town Board members shall select one of their own to preside over the meeting

AIRPORT HANGAR LEASE AGREEMENT

THIS LEASE AGREEMENT, effective the day of February 1, 2026, by and between the TOWN OF SCHROON, whose offices are located on 15 Leland Avenue, Town of Schroon, New York 12870 (Lessor) and Lewis Donnelly residing at 42 Colonial Avenue, Warwick NY 10990(Lessee).

WHEREAS, the Lessor is the owner of the Airport Hangar located on Alder Meadow Road, Town of Schroon, County of Essex, State of New York, and

WHEREAS, the Lessee is an individual who is requesting to lease space from the Lessor in the Town of Schroon Airport Hangar, and

WHEREAS, the Lessor desires to lease out space to the Lessee for the purpose of storing aircraft and related aviation equipment in the airplane hangar owned by the Lessor, and

WHEREAS, the Lessee desires to obtain and avail himself of these rights, privileges, and uses and

WHEREAS, this Agreement has been duly authorized by the Schroon Town Board at its meeting held at the Town Hall, Schroon Lake, New York on the day of 13th of January 2026.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. The Lessor shall lease to the Lessee the right and privilege, in common with others, to store aircraft and aviation equipment only in the hangar on a month-to-month basis. Lessee shall not store any other motor vehicles or items not related to aircraft.
2. The Lessor shall agree to provide parking space, by permit, in common with others, for the Lessee during the term of the lease.
3. The Lessee shall have the right to the use of the airstrip in common with others at no additional charge.
4. The Lessee shall pay the sum of Three Hundred and no/100 (\$300.00) per month per airplane and associated parking space, with a maximum of two airplanes in the hangar.
5. The Lessee shall pay the sum of Three Hundred and no/100 (\$300.00) per airplane as a security deposit to be held by the Town of Schroon, in an escrow account for this purpose, upon the signing of this lease.
6. The Lease may be renewed on an annual basis, with the security deposit made at the time of signing being transferred to the new lease. The Lessor retains the right to adjust the monthly lease amount on an annual basis.
7. The Lessee shall be responsible for providing his own liability insurance on his airplane(s) and any personal items stored in the hangar and provide proof of insurance to the Lessor upon the signing of this Agreement. Lessee's insurance shall be in the minimum amount of at least Million Dollars and also name the Town as an additional insured. Lessee shall provide the Town with a Certificate of Insurance so stating.
8. The Lessee shall be responsible for maintaining the premises in the condition on the day the lease begins for the entire term of the lease.
9. The Lessee shall be responsible for removing any and all trash from the site that he brings in.
10. There shall be no sub-letting of the hangar space by the Lessee.
11. The Lessor shall be responsible for maintaining the premises in the condition on the day the lease begins for the entire term of the lease. Any improvements made by the lessee do not alter the status of the building ownership or the lease conditions.
12. The Lessor shall maintain insurance coverage on the premises, but not to the Lessee's personal belongings and/or aircraft on the premises or any items in the parking area.
13. The Lessor may terminate this Lease Agreement by giving written notice to the Lessee thirty (30) days prior to termination for failure to meet any of its obligations under the term of this Agreement.
14. The Lessee may terminate this Lease Agreement by giving written notice to the Lessor thirty (30) days prior to termination to Town Supervisor, 15 Leland Avenue, Schroon Lake, New York, 12870.

WHEREAS, adoption of this legislation is authorized by New York General Municipal Law §103 and New York Municipal Home Rule Law §10; and

WHEREAS, Municipal Home Rule Law §20 requires the Town Board to hold a Public Hearing prior to the adoption of any Local Law,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Schroon Town Board shall meet and hold a Public Hearing at the Schroon Town Hall, 15 Leland Ave., Schroon Lake, New York, at 5:45p.m. on March 9th, 2026 to hear all interested persons and take any necessary action provided by law concerning proposed Local Law 1 of 2026; and

LOCAL LAW NO.: 1 OF 2026

A LOCAL LAW AUTHORIZING THE AWARD OF PURCHASE CONTRACTS ON THE BASIS OF BEST VALUE

ARTICLE I. BE IT ENACTED BY THE SCHROON TOWN BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE INTENT – Section 103 of the New York General Municipal Law (GML §103) requires competitive bidding for purchase contracts and public works contracts and has historically required that such bids be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder whose bid meets the requirements of the specifications for the project. However, GML §103 provides that the Town may award purchase contracts which would otherwise be subject to the "lowest bidder" on the basis of "best value", as defined in New York State Finance Law §163, if authorized by Local Law. The Town Board hereby determines that it is in the best interests of the Town and its residents for the Town Board to have the authority to award purchase contracts on the basis of best value.

SECTION 2. AUTHORIZATION OF BEST VALUE AS BASIS FOR AWARD

A. The Town may award purchase contracts, including contracts for service work, but excluding any purchase contracts necessary for the completion of a public works contract pursuant to Article 8 of the New York State Labor Law, on the basis of best value, as defined in New York State Finance Law §163, to a responsive and responsible bidder or offeror.

B. The determination to award a purchase contract on the basis of best value shall be made by the Town Board. Such determination shall include the specific criteria to be applied in determining best value which shall reflect, wherever possible, objective and quantifiable analysis. The Board shall document the determination of the evaluation criteria. The Board should use a cost-benefit analysis or other similar process to demonstrate quantifiable value or savings from non-price factors that offset the price differential of lower price offers. Such criteria may also identify a quantitative factor to be used in the evaluation of proposals from offerors that are small businesses or certified minority-owned or women-owned business enterprises as defined in subdivisions 1, 7, 15 and 20 of Executive Law §310. In making such determination, the Board shall consider the recommendation, if any, of the appropriate officer, board, agency, commission or department for which the contract is being procured.

C. The procedure for awarding a purchase contract on the basis of best value shall include public solicitation of bids and submission of sealed bids or other formal competitive procurement processes in accordance with the guidelines established under the Town's Procurement Policy. The solicitation shall include a description of the manner in which the evaluation of the bids and award of the contract will be conducted and, if appropriate, identification of the relative importance or weight of price and non-price factors. Non-price factors include, but are not limited to, such considerations as the reliability of a product, efficiency of operation, difficulty or ease of maintenance, cost of maintenance, useful lifespan, ability to meet needs regarding timeliness of performance and experience of a service provider with similar contracts.

D. Documentation of the contract award shall, where practicable, include a description of the application of the price and non-price criteria to the proposals received and an evaluation of the results or, where not practicable, such other justification which demonstrates that best value will be achieved.

E. In the event that the Town Board does not make a determination to award a contract on the basis of best value, contracts shall continue to be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder furnishing the required security as required by GML §103.

SECTION 3. The Town's Procurement Policy shall be amended to reflect the relevant provisions of this Local Law and in a manner not inconsistent with this Local Law. However, any failure to amend the Town's Procurement Policy shall have no impact whatsoever on the effectiveness of this Local Law.

ARTICLE II. SEVERABILITY – The invalidity of any clause, sentence, paragraph or provision of this Local Law shall not invalidate any other clause, sentence, paragraph or part thereof.

ARTICLE III. REPEALER – All Local Laws or ordinances or parts of Local Laws or ordinances in conflict with any part of this Local Law are hereby repealed.

ARTICLE IV. EFFECTIVE DATE – This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing in the Office of the New York Secretary of State as provided in New York Municipal Home Rule Law §27.

Supervisor Wood stated: We had talked during budget time of approving an expenditure of 50,000 for a storm water assessment of the town. This assessment is required for the town before we can go looking for grants for our storm system or our sewer systems. Saturday when I was here, I got a phone call from Sue Palisano that behind the chamber office, one of the sewer man hole lids was bubbling up. When I went over, Robbie Haff came as well, there was water coming directly from the 9-mile piping off the roof cutting through the ice and directly into the man hole. That was what was causing the man hole to bubble. That is just an example of what is happening all along Rte 9, along both sides, as well as Broad st, Cross st. Jordan st and many of our other streets. This is a compound issue, a lot of this storm water is making its way into our sewer system and we don't know if any of our sewer problems are exacerbated by the storm runoff. We have \$50,000 coming to use through the County, through our sales tax. This is new. The County is sharing this windfall with the 18 towns; they are expecting 1.8 million dollars. We are receiving \$125,000 dollars we are putting \$75,000 towards the Emergency Squad, and the remaining \$50,000 towards this storm water grant. This is not funds from the tax payers, this was not included in our budget either. We were not sure of anything until after the budget process. This money is a bonus we got, so this has no expense to the taxpayers. We think the estimate of \$50,000 is a reasonably accurate estimate. The estimate was derived from the cost of other assessments we have had done as well as with speaking to Beth Gillis, the Director of the LGLCRPB.

DISCUSSION: NEW TRANSFER STATION FEES, EFFECTIVE 2/1/26

Supervisor Wood stated: We recently due to the Ice Storm experienced some problems at the Transfer Station. The compactors were frozen as well as some electrical issues. It did take several days to get that fixed, therefor the Transfer Station was closed during its regularly scheduled hours. We realize this was a big inconvenience especially to our business that generate a lot of refuse. In respect to this issue the town board has decided to delay the price increase for the Transfer Station until February 1st, 2026. We will also be posting an ad in the Sun Community tires regarding the price changes and the new effective date.

DISCUSSION: AED STATUS

Councilperson Miller stated: I am going to meet with Keith. EMS will have recommendations for the type of AED devices as well as the cases for them and the location of them. EMS will also be the ones to manage the AED's, we will do the monthly checks for the batteries, pads and other items that require it, as well as the reports needed if the AED is used. There also needs to be a medical director established. I found a company that does this, for the nominal price of around \$100 annually per AED. I think that is very reasonable. EMS will be holding training for citizens free of charge, if the person would like an ID card stating

their status as being trained, there is a cost to that. We also would like to hold CPR classes as well. Anyone who is interested we are highly encouraging anyone who is interested to contact EMS for the training, the more the merrier.

DISCUSSION: TOWN COURT

Supervisor Wood stated: I have a letter from the Honorable Kris Singh the District Administrative Judge for the Fourth Judicial District. It was ordered that the honorable Richard Carpenter is assigned to the Schroon Town court to assist in the adjudication of matters there, effective January 1, 2026 through February 28, 2026, unless sooner terminated by Administrative Order. This is in addition to his other duties in Moriah Town Court. I believe he is only doing traffic tickets but he did 150 last week in 3 hours. That should get things caught up. We have been trying to get this December 6th 2022 when we asked for help. Hopefully we will be in better shape in the court after this.

Councilperson Gero stated: will he be giving us regular updates

Supervisor Wood stated: I hope so, we will defiantly be getting updates or reports I do not know the schedule.

Councilperson Miller stated: is 150 tickets a lot?

Supervisor Wood stated: I do not have this in writing but supposedly we are either the first or second busiest court in Essex County. We have 30 miles on the Northway.

Councilperson Williams stated: can I ask a question? The tickets are important because we get income as a Town, correct?

Supervisor Wood stated: yes. The States gets some as well.

Supervisor Wood stated: There will be a special Town Board meeting on 1/13/26 at 9PM for a Revolving Loan Fund Workshop. Hopefully this will be the last workshop meeting to get the Revolving Loan Fund back up and running.

DISCUSSION: STR

Supervisor Wood stated: this was not on the agenda but it was something interesting that was up at the county today. The Weighs and Measures department said today that there are 1485 short term rentals registered with the County. The County chose a company called Deckard Technology to start monitoring the short-term rentals. We have talked about having a moratorium here on short term rentals. With this I am glad that we did do that yet because it appears things may be changing a little at the County level. Enforcement is the main problem everywhere. The conversation today was about the County trying to figure out their plan of action, a thought was to maybe have one county wide department that manages the short-term rentals. It was just an idea; nothing is planned yet. We are all trying to figure out how to manage these.

Councilperson Gero stated: this has been a tough winter. This young man right here, from equipment failures and being shorthanded, Joe has done an amazing job. We appreciate all their hard work, the entire Highway Crew. (applause)

Councilperson Williams stated: I have had the opportunity to go around and meet everyone and meet with the departments. This Town, and our employees are unbelievable. Erica over there, the Board our office staffs, they do so much work its incredible. I want to encourage everyone to get involved. One suggestion I had was to offer a public participation section at the end of the meeting. If questions arise after hearing what's up for discussion, allowing the public to speak one more time. Another thing I want to see us work on is public relations.
