The purpose is to bring awareness and education to Schroon Lake residence and guests about Schroon Lakes commitment to becoming a Dark Sky friendly community. The reason we are doing this is to protect our natural resource of the night sky, so we are able to see the stars, moon, solar eclipse and planets and to enhance and make Schroon Lake designated Dark sky location and to protect migrant birds and pollinators to reduce green house gases, global warming and save the Town and residents money on electricity and lighting. Last year in October we had over 120 people attend, we are expecting a larger crowd for our second Star Party. Last year the bathroom light was a problem, it stays on all night and is ridiculously bright. I know you are planning on doing some work to the bathroom, I would suggest you change out the light to a light with lower lumen and kelvin, shield the light and potentially even a motion dedector light. Since we are working to becoming a dark sky community. The Dark Skies International has a Dark Sky week, this year its going to be April 13th – 20th. This is an opportunity in conjunction with Adirondack Dark Skies to ask our residence to voluntary join in the dark sky week for Schroon Lake. If Schroon Lake would sign a proclamation or sign a letter of support, for responsible outdoor lights at night. We would ask residence to turn off their lights at night. Schroon Lake could turn off their globe lights at 10PM, this would show the residences our commitment and would save the town money. The national grid lights would still be burning. It would be a statement from the Town.

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the Town of Schroon Town Board, and substantiated by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, that the deer population in Essex County is suffering from severe depredation due to dogs attacking, chasing or worrying deer; and

WHEREAS, it is the duty of this Board of Supervisors to protect the natural resources of this County from unnecessary depredation, a duty that this Board has conscientiously accepted over the years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, pursuant to Section 120 of the Agriculture and Markets Law, that this Town of Schroon Town Board hereby orders, that all dogs in the Town of Schroon shall be securely confined during the period of time beginning with the required publication of this notice and ending on May 1, 2026; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that, pursuant to such law, if any dog shall kilt or cripple any deer, the owner of such dog shall be subject to a civil penalty in the amount of \$100 for the first deer killed or crippled and \$150 for each additional deer so killed or crippled, to be recovered in an action brought by the Commissioner of Environmental Conservation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Town Board of Schroon hereby approves the Ordering the Confinement of Dogs to Protect the Deer Herd.

DISCUSSION: REPAINTING THE SURFACE OF THE PARK BASKETBALL COURT AND POSSIBLE MODIFICATIONS IN STRUCTURES OF HOOPS – COMPREHENSIVE PLAN UPDATE

Deputy Supervisor Gero stated: we have a price to paint and resurface the basketball court, it is under State contract and the price is \$ 18,500.00. However, we are going to have some discussion on it because we think there may be some changes needed to the court.

Councilperson Williams stated: We have had our court for a long time. I have noticed that what happens is people come full speed and where the basketball court is set up, they could possibly get their foot caught under the fence. When I was young and restless, as a kid I would jump onto the fence, and you can see now that is still happening by the way that fence is bowing from the extra weight. One idea I had was to change the basketball rims and move them a lot closer, so there would be space between the players and the fence. I went down to the YMCA in Glens Falls and took some photos, to get some ideas. I still need to do more research on the poles themselves. Can they be moved? What are they made out of? Do we need anything special for the poles? Can the rims be moved? I am still working on the research part of all this. I would suggest we hold off on any paving or resurfacing until we know what we are doing with the court itself. I just want to make sure we do all this once.

My main concern with the court is a safety issues. People could get their ankles stuck under there, and that would be really painful.

Deputy Supervisor Gero stated: there was concerns previously as well about a low section right behind Roger's house, we did get some material in there and got that leveled off but that may be one of the things we need to address again if we make changes. Also, maybe some time of protective padding behind the back boards as well?

Councilperson Welch stated: I know that we budgeted in the fall \$25,000 for the basketball court for resurfacing and maintenance. Any thoughts Ethan?

Buildings and Grounds Maintenance: No just because I have never done it before. I would reach out to CRAFTCO, they did our tennis courts, see what's involved.

Deputy Supervisor Gero stated: yep, they are on State contract and they are the ones that gave us this quote. Sounds like we have a lot more research to do on this before we move forward with it.

DISCUSSION: GOLF COURSE WORKSHOP- COMPREHENSIVE PLAN UPDATE

Deputy Supervisor Gero stated: We originally had a resolution item on the agenda that had to do with the golf course but since then there are a lot of things that we need to discuss. Some of the people that have worked there in the past have moved on to bigger and better things. There are a number of things that we need to sit down with Jon Swinton to discuss. Meg asked me if we can sit down and set up a date for a golf course workshop and that would be open to the public. Tuesday the 17th was a suggestion but that date doesn't work for Leanna. So, let's put our thinking caps on soon and see if we can come up with a date. Once we do, we will get that advertised and it will be open to the public. We will reach out to John Swinton of course and work around his schedule.

DISCUSSION: TRANSFER STATION – CLOSED SIGN FOR MECHAINCAL/WEATHER INTERRUPTIONS, NEW SYSTEM TO INTERGRATE SMALL SCALE, WEIGHT DISPLAY, PAYMENT SIGNAGE DISPLAY

Deputy Supervisor Gero stated: Meg purchased a new sign, that will be put on the gate when ever its closed for any reason. I know we have had some mechanical issues with the weather, so this sign is to help get the message and the word out as to why the dump is closed during those time periods. We are still in the information gathering phase in terms of a new scale system, we are looking into a digital scale system with a weight display.

DISCUSSION: 7 NEW GARAGE DOORS ON OLD HIGHWAY BUILDING INSTALLED

Deputy Supervisor Gero stated: we are in the process of having new overhead doors installed. We have had a few issues that representatives from the company came up to meet with myself, Meg and Ethan. We chose Windchip doors because they currently hold the maintenance contract with them. Things have not gone too smooth.

Ethan Thompson stated: They called last week to see where we were at, they have some things to finish up, they need to replace a panel that was damaged during installation. As well as a few brackets that were damaged during shipping or installation. The rest of the kinks were worked our fairly well.

Deputy Supervisor Gero stated: We have not been impressed with the installation as whole but I guess we are getting there.

Ethan Thompson stated: the doors themselves are nice; with this cold weather we are having they are much better sealing and insulation. It is 1000% improvement over what we had; it was just a process to get there.

DISCUSSION: ROGERS BROOK WASTEWATER PROJECT STATUS- COMPREHENSIVE PLAN UPDATE

Deputy Supervisor Gero stated: we recently had a meeting with a number of representatives from various agencies regarding the up-and-coming Rogers Brook project. DEC, EFC our engineers from EDR, and several members of the board. I think the meeting went well. It was very productive. Brian has done a lot of research and has come up with an option where we can put the laterals up behind the affected businesses on main street, and hook them up to the main. DEC seemed to be agreeable to that.

Wastewater Chief Ritchings stated: they were happy because there is very little environmental impact.

Deputy Supervisor Gero stated: We are still in the planning phases. They are going to take what we talked about back to their office and have some more conversations with their engineers and get back to us.

Wastewater Chief Ritchings stated: the only thing they had questions on was the removal of the pipe.

Deputy Supervisor Gero stated: there are options for the existing pipe in the brook. We talked about capping and filling with flowable material. It would be a lot more cost effective for the town to leave it in there. We had Jessica Deslauries and Anna Reynolds, they are two folks that work for Essex County that are trying to secure grants for us. They are excellent to work with. This project is going to be very expensive. Its slowly moving forward.

DISCUSSION: APA PLANNING FORUM MAY 6&7

Deputy Supervisor Gero stated: May 6 &7, 2026 there is the Adirondack Planning Forum. It's usually at the Hotel Saranac; we usually go up for the day of the 6th and the 7th. We have been in the past and its very beneficial.

DISCUSSION: HYDROLOGIC ASSESSMENT OF HAMLET – STORM WATER RUN OFF REP READY TO RELEASE- COMPREHENSIVE PLAN UPDATE

Deputy Supervisor Gero stated: the hydrologic assessment for the hamlet. The RFP needs some modification, when they did the original map, they did not go big enough, they did not include the entire hamlet in the storm water system so that will need to be changed. I also have an issue, that no where in this project was it stated that DOT was involved. I think DOT needs to absolutely be involved.

DISCUSSION: EVENTS – SNOW DAY IN THE PARK 2/15/2026
CHAMBER OF COMMERCE SEEKING EVENT COORDINATOR

Deputy Supervisor Gero stated: I was hoping Sue Palisano would be here to talk a little about the Snow Day in the park next weekend. There will be cardboard sled races, there may be some sort of food vendor or hot cocoa. More information is available on the Chamber's website. So please visit their website for more info.

PUBLIC DISCUSSION REGARDING MEETING ITEMS:

Joy Koch stated: I just wanted to say thank you, I could actually HEAR you the entire meeting. Meg either needs a microphone or we need better acoustics in this room.

Councilperson Williams stated: I have been thinking a lot about the Comprehensive plan and I think that is a great guideline that we have. I would hope that as we work on these projects that we continue to further the comprehensive plan and check of that we are doing these things. The other thing, that in that plan it talks about we should be updating as we go. It keeps us informed and it keeps the community aware of what we are doing. It also is a great segway for grants, because it shows that we are using our comprehensive plan. I still would encourage us to see if we can get some of the previous members on the committee to help us with some of the research or things we don't have time for.
