**LOCAL LAW NO. 2 OF THE YEAR 2026**

**Town of Schroon, County of Essex**

**A Local Law to Prohibit Camping or Sleeping in Town Parks, Public Sidewalks, Streets, Alleyways or other Public Rights of Way**

BE IT ENACTED, by the Town Board of Schroon, County of Essex, State of New York, as follows:

**Section 1. Legislative Intent**

It is the intent of this local law to prohibit camping or sleeping in/on town parks, public sidewalks, public streets, alleyways, or any other public right of way. People camping or sleeping in town parks, on public property, or in public right of ways, creates a public health and safety hazard and interferes with the rights of others to use the areas for which they were intended.

**Section 2. Authority**

The authority to adopt this local law is derived from Article IX, Section 2(c) of the New York Constitution; Article 2 Section 10 of the Statute of Local Governments, and Article 2, Section 10 of the Municipal Home Rule Law, which authorizes the Town to adopt local laws and regulations that advance and protect the health, safety and welfare of the community.

**Section 3. Definitions**

Unless the context requires otherwise the following definitions apply.

A. "To Camp" means to set up or to remain in or at a campsite.

B. "Campsite" means any place where bedding, sleeping bag, or other material used for bedding purposes, or any stove or fire is placed, established, or maintained for the purpose of maintaining a temporary place to live, whether or not such place incorporates the use of any tent, lean-to, shack, or any other structure, or any vehicle or part thereof.

C. "Prohibited Public Places" means any place not designated as a public campground pursuant to Federal, State or

local statute or ordinance and shall include the following:

- a) Public streets, sidewalks, alleyways, passages and rights of way;
- b) Publicly owned property;
- c) Public parks;
- d) Public parking lots, whether publicly owned or privately;
- e) Public landscaped areas, whether publicly or privately owned and maintained pursuant to a public easement or agreement for public maintenance;
- f) Private property that is readily accessible to the general public or is otherwise open to common general use;
- g) Vacant lots that are readily accessible to the general public or otherwise open to common general use or that attract activity that may pose a threat to public health and safety; and
- h) Drainage culverts and basins.

**Section 4. Sleeping or Camping is Prohibited on Sidewalks, Streets, Alleys, or Within Doorways or in Prohibited Public Places**

- a) No person may sleep or camp on public sidewalks, streets, alleyways, or other prohibited public places at any time as a matter of individual and public safety.
- b) No person may sleep or camp in any pedestrian or vehicular entrance to public or private property abutting a public sidewalk.
- c) In addition to any other remedy provided by law, any person found in violation of this section may be immediately removed from the premises.

**Section 5. Camping Prohibited**

No person may occupy a campsite in or upon any sidewalk, street, alley, lane, public right of way, park, bench, or any other prohibited public place, or under any bridge or viaduct, unless (i) otherwise specifically authorized by this Local Law, (ii) by a formal declaration of the Town of Schroon Town Board in emergency circumstances, or (iii) upon Board resolution, the town may exempt a special event from the prohibitions of this section, if the Town Board finds such exemption to be in the public interest and consistent with Town goals and notices. Any conditions imposed will include a condition requiring that the applicant provide evidence of adequate insurance coverage and agree to indemnify the Town for any liability, damage or expense incurred by the Town as a result of activities of the applicant.

Any findings by the Town Board shall specify the exact dates and location covered by the exemption.

**Section 6. Removal of Campsite on Public Property**

Upon discovery of a campsite on public property, removal of the campsite by Law Enforcement may occur under the following circumstances:

- A. Prior to removing the campsite, the Town shall attempt to give prior notice in advance at the campsite.
- B. The Town shall inform a local agency (delivering social services to homeless individuals) of the location of the campsite.
- C. Law Enforcement is authorized to remove the campsite and all personal property related thereto.

**Section 7. Disposition and Release of Personal Property**

For purposes of this Local Law, "personal property" means any item reasonably recognizable as belonging to a person and having apparent utility or monetary value. Items having no apparent utility or monetary value and items in an unsanitary condition may be immediately discarded. Weapons, drug paraphernalia, items appearing to be stolen, and evidence of a crime may be retained as evidence by the Law Enforcement until an alternate disposition is determined. All personal property removed from the campsite which is not retained, disposed of, or held as evidence (as provided above) shall be stored by the Law Enforcement as per their policy, during which time it shall be reasonably available for and released to an individual confirming ownership.

**Section 8. Enforcement**

This local law shall be enforced by any officer of the Essex County Sheriff's Office, NYS Police, the Town Code Enforcement Officer, or any other police officer authorized as such by the State of New York.

**Section 9. Penalties**

A violation of this Local Law shall be deemed an offense punishable by a fine up to \$500 or imprisonment up to 15 days, or both.

**Section 10. Severability**

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance, shall be adjusted by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this Local Law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

**Section 11. Effective date**

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

**Section 12. Amendments**

This Local Law may be amended from time to time by Town Board resolution

**DISCUSSION: ESSEX COUNTY OCCUPANCY TAX RECORD KEEPING**

Supervisor Wood stated: Essex County has a County Occupancy Tax, related to Short Term Rentals. It was created years ago. No one ever thought it would grow to over 7 million dollars a year. The towns share this; there is a long formula based on how many residents you have and more. We are fortunate, our share of that tax is substantial. In 2024 we received \$153,877.00 in 2025 \$124,154. The reason it is lower is that they are making the payments quarterly now and we didn't get the last quarter of 2025 until 2026. This money is supposed to be used to support the community and the tourism needs. Not just used for chamber of commerce or arts council. It can be used for sidewalks, lighting, beach improvements, things like that. The one thing the county has wanted the towns to do is to take this money as it comes in and keep a record of how the money is spent. It was suggested that this money be put into a separate account so we can accurately track what this money goes to. Some of the items that this money was used for includes, Arts Council, Historical Society, 4<sup>th</sup> of July event, Porta Potty rental for the 4<sup>th</sup>, Road signs, Boat Patrol, Airport Maintenance, Sidewalks, Senior Center, Ice Rink maintenance, park restroom updates, the Tennis Court and the ski tow. We can use this money for the basketball court that we just talked about.

**DISCUSSION: HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT SWEEPER REPLACEMENT**

Highway Superintendent Flores stated: The sweeper we have now is a 2005. It spent a lot of time down, and needed to go to Albany to be repaired. I know this is a big expense but this piece of equipment does a lot for the town. A new sweeper is \$297,334.23. I know its not in the budget this year, but this is something we need to consider purchasing soon. So, I wanted to bring it up to the board, so it is on everyone's radar.

**DISCUSSION: HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT FUEL PUMP SYSTEM REPLACEMENT**

Highway Superintendent Flores stated: I got a price back form E&FS, the tank that we have there is 27 years old and takes are only good for 30 years. The price that is included here is the price that includes everything. New tank, taking out the old tank, new system, new cards, new everything. The price is \$453,799. The current fuel system is used by the highway, water, sewer, the fire trucks, ambulances, snowmobile club, school buses, codes, any and all of our town vehicles. It does get a lot of use. In the winter time it does give us a lot of trouble, I did have some folks come and look at it and they said that they system is just so old that there isn't much we can do to improve upon what we currently have.

Supervisor Wood stated: we will have to figure out the percentage of use and figure out how we allocate the cost of this improvement. This should not come out of just highways budget. We will work with the comptroller on this to try and figure out the best way to do that.

Amanda Ragland stated: Can I ask a question for my own knowledge? What is the cost savings to having this with the town verses going to Stewarts or Sunoco? How does this save us money?

Highway Superintendent Flores stated: it is not about the cost savings it is about functionality. You cannot get a firetruck into Stewarts to get gas. The same with the large snow plows, there is just not way to get in and out of there safely, even if the parking lot was completely empty it would still be difficult to get in there and nearly impossible to turn around a fire truck.

Councilperson Gero stated: we also buy diesel on state contract, so we do not pay the pump price.

**DISCUSSION: ZONING/STR**

Supervisor Wood stated: I just wanted to update you on zoning. One of the first steps in the comprehensive plan is zoning. Hopefully we can get some help with having some professional people come to analysis what we have and to help us get this off the ground. This is a long process, hopefully a year time line. Part of the zoning that interests me is the Short Term Rental issues that we have. We will hopefully be putting out an RPF for these services soon.

**DISCUSSION: ROGERS BROOK WASTEWATER PROJECT STATUS**

Supervisor Wood stated; we had a meeting on February 6<sup>th</sup>; there were 6 or 8 different people that came from various agencies. The meeting was very informative. We are working on the DEC, and getting them to work in conjunction with the DOT in regards to the bridge over Rogers Brook, and also working on the wastewater system because our sewer line is right under the bridge. There is a lot of coordinating that needs to happen to get this project going. We did get a large grant for this project, over \$800,000 dollar grant. The project is taking so long, the grant expired but we were given an extension because it's the planning phase that is taking so long.

**DISCUSSION: HYDROLOGIC ASSESSMENT RFP**

Supervisor Wood stated: the next thing is storm water. This is a huge problem in town, all throughout town. We want to have, eventually, upgrades to the sewer system. We will need to do BIDS to get upgrades to a sewer system in the hamlet. We have \$50,000 to get an engineer report to help us get that started. This is a step to get started, everything has to be done in order. We can't get grants if we don't have the engineer study

Highway Superintendent Flores stated: one thing I wanted to mention while we are talking about stormwater. Across the street here we have that issue. We need to figure out who owns what so we can figure out how to get this fixed. It is getting worse and someone needs to address it.

Donnal Hall stated: I am the manager of the apartments over there and I have a contactor coming tomorrow to look at it. Hopefully they will come up with some kind of repair. I prefer that we don't take full responsibility of the situation. Something has to be done; we have been going back and forth on who owns it.

**DISCUSSION: WATER DEPARTMENT IMPROVEMENTS**

Supervisor Wood stated: Greg Swart of Suozzo, Doty and Associates came up and gave us his thoughts on some sort of an RFP for our water tank. We have a water tank engineer person coming soon to do a structural inspection of that tank on Route 9. That tank is approximately 63 years old.

**DISCUSSION: ESSEX COUNTY HOUSING INITIATIVES**

Supervisor Wood stated: the Essex County Housing Initiatives. There was an event recently that was put on by the Adirondack Community Foundation. People came to present were people that I have met in my travels over the last 10 or so years. Board members also went, along with many members of our community. I spoke to Kelly Brooks a member of the foundation, I talked with two other board members of that foundation who happen to be resident of this town. I talked to the head of Roost, Nicole Justice-Green who is one of the people presenting. I was able to talk to Kathy Fariss and her son, I spoke to Kevin Kavanaugh. It was not an event put on by the town. We went to be informed.

**DISCUSSION: APA PLANNING FORUM MAY 6& 7 IN SARANAC LAKE**

Supervisor Wood stated: The APA Planning Forum is coming up. I believe the agenda is to address Short Term Rentals and zoning all day long.

**DISCUSSION: REVOLVING LOAN FUND**

Supervisor Wood stated: They met this week upstairs. Cathy Moses Bryerton, Sue Palisano, Fran Mahler, Roger Sachleben, and Donna Sennaville met and went over the new policy,

Councilperson Gero stated: it went well Sue had posed some really good questions. Donna is going to inquire with the bank to get more details. Donna will be the chair person. Cathy and Roger will be the two-year members. The membership has to be staggered so that we can continue a quorum. Sue, Donna and Fran will be the three-year members.

Supervisor Wood stated: one thing we have to remember is that we are not a bank. If the money is to be applied for then a lending institution has to send us a written recommendation that the person is not eligible for their products and they thing it will be a good fit for the Revolving Loan Fund. All the years this has been available, we only had one default. Thankfully we did not take ownership of the building, that saved us in the long run. The Town Board has nothing to do with the decisions on this. Diane Tyrell will be managing the paperwork upstairs but the Town Board has nothing to do with this committee.

**DISCUSSION: LETTER OF SUPPORT FOR DARK SKY INITIATIVE**

Supervisor Wood stated: I got a letter from Joy Koch, she is looking for a letter of support. There is a grant from the institute of museum and library services. This outfit is promoting the awareness of light pollution, and they are looking to lead action to reducing it across the Adirondacks. They are trying to get Tupper Lake labeled as a dark sky community. Receiving this grant would allow Tupper Lake to increase out educational program and outreach. I do not have a problem writing a letter of support for Tupper Lake.

**DISCUSSION: SKATING RINK**

Supervisor Wood stated: I asked Patrick to close the rink down because its just all slouchy. I think its best to shut it down for the season.

**PUBLIC COMMENTS ON AGENDA ITEMS:**

Vicki Vallie stated: you referred to something earlier and called it chip money, what is chip money?

Highway Superintendent Flores stated: CHIPS money is what the State gives us, Consolidated Highway Improvement. You can use it to buy equipment, and pave the roads. There is a big long formula that determines how much we get, but it is money from the state.

Councilperson Gero stated: it's with great sadness that I am announcing the passing of Lillian Richardson. A lot of times we bounce the word "special" around, but in this case, it is spot on. She in my opinion is the ultimate goal of what an educator should be. I would like to acknowledge everything she has done for this community.

Highway Superintendent Flores stated: I put it on Facebook but just so everyone knows the roads are posted for weight effective today, and will be lifted around April. The Town of Schroon Temporary Road closure effective March 9<sup>th</sup> 2026, all town roads are closed to vehicles over 4 tons gross weight until further notice.

Councilperson Williams stated: thank you everyone for coming. I just wanted to say how wonderful it is that we live here and that we have such a wonderful community. I know I am new here but I just really wanted to say, Meg Wood works so very hard for the town. She has a lot of things up in the air along with the rest of the board and Erica. They do so much for this town and I think for a lot of people on the outside of the Town Hall, they do not really know how much these people do for our town. Its incredible. Now that I am on the board, I can see in detail everything that they do. Its great. Thank you to all of you.
